

What is the EFMP?

- EFMP is a **mandatory enrollment program** administered by the medical community. They work with key community agencies to identify active-duty sponsors with family members with a special, educational, and/or medical need.
- One of the goals is to **protect the federal entitlements and military benefits of family members** as they move around the world with their active-duty sponsors.
- The 3 components of EFMP strive to ensure AF sponsors are assigned in locations that can **support** both the mission and well-being of families.

Who is an EFM?

An Exceptional Family Member (EFM) is a family member/dependent enrolled in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) who as a diagnosed physical, intellectual, and/or emotional-psychological condition that **Requires** ongoing specialized medical and/or educational services.

Examples might include but are not limited to a family member (adult/child) with Diabetes, Cancer, Asthma, Depression, ADHD, Developmental Delays, Individualized Educational Plans (IEPs), or an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP).

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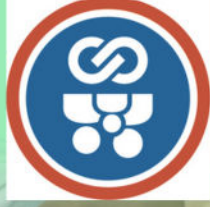

Family Support (FS)

- EFMF-Family Support (FS) Helps families navigate, advocate, and connect to agencies both on/off connection. With the goal to establish and maintain community.
- Completes Family Needs Assessments (FNA) and/or Service Plans (SP) when your family identifies a need, is PCSing or is separating.
- EFMF-FS provides: Information and referrals, 1:1 non-clinical consultations, Education and outreach, EFMF recreational events, EFMF Quarterly newsletter, Warm hand-offs to your next duty location.

Identification & Enrollment

- EFMF (M) works with families to coordinate identification and enrollment into the EFMF.
- Is the contact for when your family is set to PCS to a new location and in the process of completion the Family Member Travel Screener (FMTS).
- Handles EFMF reassignments due to lack of medical and educational services for the EFMF(s) at the current duty location.
